We may be weary from the disorienting challenges of this year, but our path in this world is lit before us. Friends, we are part of an ongoing story of God's expansive love through this child whose birthday we celebrate every Christmas. It is in this light that our faith begins. It is in this light that we are able to see God's purpose. It is in this light that we proclaim that no darkness can overcome.


