John 1:1-5

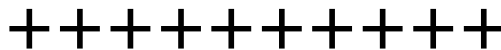

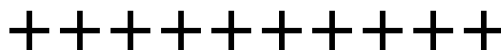

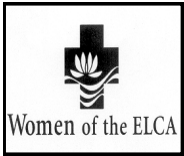
As we have been planning and preparing for inside worship, we recognize and thank John Holbrook for creating communion cup trays for the pews. Thank you John! They are a work of art!

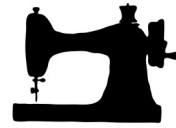

In the meantime, plans are progressing for new worship procedures starting November 29, 2020.

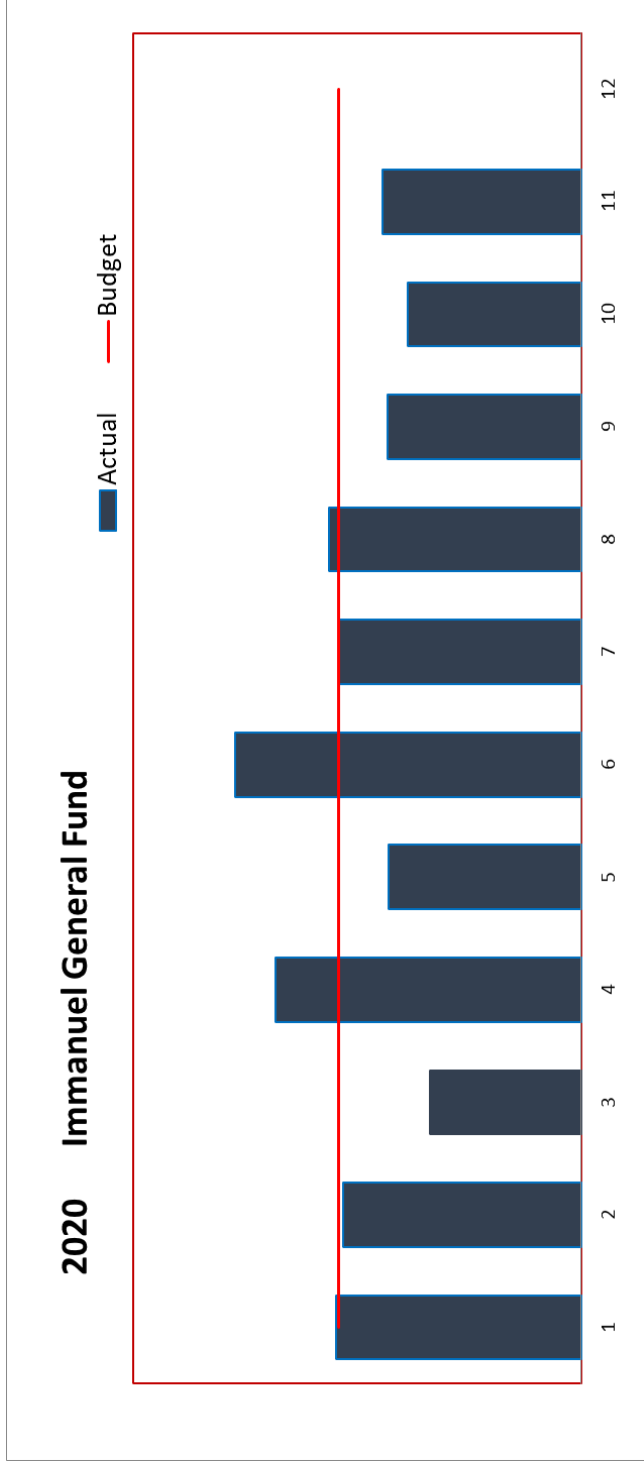
